The North Dakota 4-H Program has offered camping as educational experience since 1967. Programs are designed to develop life skills for safe and healthful living, enhance personal development, and provide constructive uses of leisure time. We are committed to providing a safe environment where youth can make new friends and develop new skills.

Our facilities include a main dining hall, an educational center with showering facilities, Butler Outpost multipurpose building and three sleeping cabins. The camp has walking trails along the Missouri River and lots of open spaces to enjoy.

Our staff members are trained in outdoor skills, science, agriculture, and human development to work with youth to ensure a high-quality experience for campers.

In addition to the planned education program, recreational opportunities are included for each camp. Campers enjoy many activities, including our walking trails, fishing pond, kayaking, and archery. Campers especially like the evening campfires, waterslide, and a dance.

● Livestock Camp

May 28 – June 1 Ages: 8-18 Cost: \$350

Learn how to show and fit your livestock in preparation for your county fair or achievement day. Learn to groom, clip and show a variety of livestock. Youth will learn about proper ways of feeding and selecting competitive livestock projects. A showmanship contest will be held, and awards will be given. Also, test your knowledge of livestock with quiz bowl activities. Campers are encouraged to bring their own animals. (No rabbits or poultry.) You will note which species you're bringing in the online registration.

● Just Starting to Ride: Wish I Had a Horse Camp

May 28 – June 1 Ages: 9-11 Cost: \$375

Have you always wanted a horse? If so, this camp is for you. Come learn how to saddle, bridle, ride, lead and care for a horse. From grooming demonstrations to a halter show, this is your chance to experience what owning a horse is like. This is a beginner camp for youth interested in horses. An animal is not required.

● Bullseye Archery Camp

June 9 – 13 Ages: 8-12 Cost: \$350

Is archery your passion? This camp is designed to improve your shooting skills. Youth will participate in 3D, World Archery field archery and National Field Archery Association field archery. Archers will make an archery target butt or bow stand. Archery challenges and recreation will make for a full week of fun and skill development. Youth can bring their own equipment.

● 4-H Adventure Camp I

● Clover Camp I

June 14 – 15 Ages: 5-9 Cost: \$175

There is required work to complete before camp begins. Information will be mailed out to participants. Hunter Education requires a minimum of 14 hours. In addition, learn basic survival and first aid skills, and basic trapping skills and tree stand safety.

● Clover Camp II

● Trades Camp

July 28 – Aug. 1 Ages: 13-18 Cost: \$350

Trades Camp is a great introduction for youth interested in exploring high-demand skilled trade careers in carpentry, electricity, welding, small engines and many others. This exciting hands-on camp will introduce youth to professionals in skilled trade careers. Trades Camp introduces youth to the industry, highlighting well-paying, in-demand jobs not requiring a four-year college degree.

● STEM Explorer Camp

July 28 – Aug. 1 Ages: 10-15 Cost: \$350

Do you enjoy being creative with STEM activities? STEM Explorer Camp is your chance to experience fun science, technology and engineering activities. The summer camp setting allows campers to incorporate nature and the outdoors into STEM. Activities will include Rube Goldberg machines, drones, robotics, food science and creative nature activities.

● Wildlife Camp

Aug. 4 – 8 Ages: 10-14 Cost: \$350

Campers can expect to be immersed in information on creatures from the very tiny to the biggest fur bearers in North Dakota. Campers will enjoy hikes, experiments and creature adaptations to learn what makes them unique.

● Chef Camp

Aug. 4 – 8 Ages: 10-16 Cost: \$350

Are you a young cooking enthusiast looking to enhance your culinary skills? Campers will explore different methods of cooking and experiment with a variety of ingredients and flavors through hands-on cooking activities. Youth will learn essential kitchen skills such as knife handling, meal planning and food safety. The camp aims to foster a sense of teamwork, creativity and cultural appreciation through working in groups, collaborating on recipes and showcasing culinary creations. Ignite your passion for cooking and gain valuable life skills at Chef Camp.

● Livestock Artificial Insemination Camp

Sept. 14 – 15 Ages: 13-19 Cost: \$100

Livestock Artificial Insemination Camp will teach youth about the science of artificial insemination. Learn about the anatomy of beef, sheep and swine and the protocols utilized to breed each of these species. Through hands-on activities, participants will learn about estrous, heat detection, breeding equipment, protocols and proper handling of AI tools.

Farm Safety Camps 2024

Ages: 13-16 Cost: \$300

Farm Safety Camp is an overnight, hands-on, workforce safety skill development program designed for youth ages 13-16 years old who plan to work for a farmer/rancher, either on their own farm or for a non-family related operator.

Participants will learn about:

- Safe tractor operation, including a tractor driving obstacle course
- Livestock handling
- ATV certification through North Dakota Parks and Recreation
- Rules of the road
- Farm machinery operation
- Farm first-aid, including official Stop the Bleed certification
- Agricultural youth laws
- Equipment operation and maintenance
